Nano Exhibit traveling to CDM!

Staff recently learned that the CDM has been awarded a collaborative grant for a mini exhibition called Nano!



Nano is an interactive exhibition that engages family audiences in nanoscale science, engineering, and technology. Hands-on exhibits present the basics of nanoscience and engineering, introduce real world applications, and explore the societal and ethical implications of this new technology.

Nano was created by the Nanoscale Informal Science Education Network (NISE Network) with support from the National Science Foundation. This collaborative grant enables us to partner with the Discovery Center Museum in Rockford, IL and the Orpheum Children's Science Museum in Champaign, IL to host the mini-exhibition on a rotation schedule amongst the three institutions for the next three years. As soon as we are notified of our exhibition dates, we'll be sure to share them with you, so stay tuned!

Every Friday for the past nine years, JoAnn Emerson has started her day at 4 a.m. Her husband, she jokes, gets to sleep in until about 6:30. On most days, however, Dale Emerson wakes up at 3:30 to start his flex shift at Horace Mann Insurance in Springfield where the couple lives. For the past nine years, Dale has worked 10 hours a day, Monday through Thursday, so he and JoAnn can have Fridays off to spend time with their grandchildren. "It's important to have a bond with them. We know they'll go off and do their own things one day. But we'll always have these Fridays," says JoAnn.

Finally, Evan, who turned 5 this April, will be attending kindergarten in the fall and the Emerson's trips to the Children's Discovery Museum may become less frequent. But, they won't end. "We may start volunteering here!" JoAnn says. "We've always loved how personable and friendly the staff has been." Though, at this time next year, the Museum may have one less knight bravely scaling the Lucky Climber, the staff is honored to be a part of such an extraordinary family and the memories they have made playing and learning together.
